UU The Vote

It is finally Primary Season in our democratic election process, the time when candidates metaphorically take off their gloves and really go after one another. I, for one, am not looking forward to the fighting and mudslinging and bad feelings, which are bound to appear as we get closer to our actual elections.

I do find some solace, though, in the **UU The Vote** movement within Unitarian Universalism. Hopefully it will help us to find a way to discuss our differences and remind us that in the end, our goals are all the same. On March 1, we will learn more about *UU The Vote* during our Sunday service. I hope that everyone will be there.

During the middle of March, our topics will focus on justice for women and justice for LGBTQ folks. The recent conviction of Harvey Weinstein returns focus to the ME TOO Movement. In truth, though, women have been unjustly treated in so many more ways than just sexual abuse and assault. Economically, maternally, legally, and philosophically, women are constantly seeking understanding and equity from a society that has long been run by privileged white males. As we continue our Sunday Services on injustice, I look forward to many enlightening and interesting discussions with you.

One of my goals for New Hope in 2020 is to renew our "Welcoming Congregation" status with the Unitarian Universalist Association. New Hope has proudly flown our rainbow flag for more than ten years. Once again a few weeks ago, it was stolen from the front of our building. We will replace the flag and buy a more secure flag pole. GLBTQ rights have always been an important value for us, as individuals and as a congregation.

On March 22, we will celebrate World Water Day and our collection will be donated to "We The People Of Detroit" to enable them to supply water to Detroit households who have had their water shut off. There continue to be many people in the city who have lost water service because they cannot afford to pay their bills, or there are disputes over the amounts they owe and the water company does not rectify the problems in a timely manner. Imagine being a single mother in a house with no running water!

At the end of March, our last Sunday topic will be about the injustices in the courts and prisons systems. We recently watched a Bryan Stevenson TED Talk entitled: "Let's Talk About Injustice." On March 29, we will continue the conversation that we started on that day. I know that some of you are reading his book <u>Just Mercy.</u> Please share your thoughts with us.



Our February social justice project was **Soles 4 Souls**. Bonnie Campbell, with help from Corinne Kelleher, have rubber banded 192 pairs of shoes as I write this and there are more to be counted. Thanks to everyone who helped to make this project a great success!

Also a hearty thanks to our Charity Poker volunteers, and to Dennis Strasser and Mike Kelleher for making the arrangements. New Hope is grateful for all you do!

Our March Project is our collection for "We The People Of Detroit", a group dedicated to supplying water for families in need in the City. Please write a check out to them. Thank you for your continuing need to be involved in creating justice for all!
